# St. Therese News

The St. Therese Institute has wrapped up our program year, and the young adults have gone home. Pray for these young Catholics as they re-enter the world, that they will truly be the love of Christ everywhere they go.

At the end of May, the St. Therese Institute will have a roofing crew here to help us get our new roof onto the chapel. We've run into a concern with asbestos shingles, which is going to increase the cost of our roof project by \$15,000. If you want to support the capital campaign but haven't yet, please help us meet this extra challenge by supporting us now. This summer, St. Therese Institute will have three interns - Jack Legge, Jeremiah Evans, and Maximilian Connelly - working with our staff on sustainability initiatives.

- We have planted our large produce garden and will plan to run canning seminars for both STIFM students and interested Bruno parishioners when we harvest in the fall. This is a program we hope to develop into an annual tradition. We are also seeking donations of canning supplies in support of this initiative.
- We have also begun keeping a small number of chickens in our back orchards this summer, too, and will slaughter flocks in the mid-summer and in the fall to supply our own kitchen more sustainably for the program year.
- There will also be upkeep around the orchards, grounds, and buildings to keep the young men busy.

Speaking of the St. Therese orchards, we have received the unfortunate expert opinion that ours are largely unsustainable. The cherry variety that was planted is susceptible to a variety of blights that require significant investment in spraying. The orchard rows were also planted too close together, which made the orchards inaccessible to normal orchard machinery. As a result of these difficulties, added to some difficulty finding regular markets for the cherries themselves, our professional orchard-management partners have asked to be released from their contract with the St. Therese orchards. In response, our first step this summer will be to prune back the majority of our trees. This is a normal practice that allows new shoots to grow, but in our case, it will also give us some time to consider options for the use of the orchards or the orchard land. We will maintain only a small number of trees in the meantime, possibly only in the small front orchard that touches Ursuline Avenue.

Ending on a fun note: the St. Therese Institute will host the "Coffee Row" folks from over at the Prairie View community this summer in our coffee lounge. Coffee Row lost their previous morning coffee location and was looking for options. Now they will meet every weekday - from 7:30-9:00 a.m. - at St. Therese. We are honored to be the seasonal home for this important part of our Bruno community. Welcome, Coffee Row!




# Cathy Glass Books & Biography







I have a degree in education and psychology. Our staff would like to take this opportunity thank all those that took the time to celebrate Early Childhood Education Month with us.






